




#### CAMP COOK WEEKEND

## **Recipe of the Month**

#### FRYPAN PIZZA — courtesy Hillbilly Cookbook

In a bowl place I cup of warm water, 1/2 a teaspoon of salt, 1 teaspoon of sugar, 1 sachet of dried yeast and stir. Add 2 cups of flour and 1/2 a teaspoon of oregano [dried].

Mix briskly until soft dough forms. Cover and put in a warm place to rise.

Oil medium frypan and press dough evenly to edges. Cover with tomato paste and sprinkle with herbs and garlic. Top with grated cheese and your choice of toppings. Cover pan with foil and pres down around all the edges.

Place pan over low heat as not to burn the base. Keep checking. Cook for 15-20 minutes.

#### COOK SLOWLY

If you use the campoven for pizza, remember you can place heat on the top of the pan as well as underneath.
