"President Report"



Welcome all again.

The committee met on Monday and discussed the future direction of the Club. In two months time we will be having our Annual General Meeting (AGM) and all Directors positions will be available. If you wish to put something back into the club, please consider helping out where ever you can.

Other points discussed were: was a discount structure on membership for people that do put into the club, either from committee or running trips. At this stage this will not go ahead, as all members should be treated equally.

Club fees will be due at the AGM in May. You can pay from any time now. Fees will be increasing to \$60 per year next year. A discount structure will apply to those people that pay on time. If payment is made by the end of the AGM in May, you will receive a \$10 discount. After July, if payment still not received, you will be regarded as non financial, and your magazine will not appear in your folder, and you will be expected to sign in as a visitor to the club at each event.

This year we had some great sponsorship of the club magazine through advertising. I encourage all club members to consider these businesses for there next purchase of goods. We will be looking for new sponsors next year. If you are currently advertising and wish to continue or if you have a business that you would like to advertise in the magazine, please give your details to me, or the magazine editor.

For people interested in becoming a Director of Mount Lofty Rangers, I have put together a brief description as I see it.

President: The president of the club is the chairperson for the general

meetings held each month. Plus he is to chair the Committee meeting held quarterly. The president is a central point for any issues and questions relating to the club and its activities. He / She gives an overview of club activities on a monthly basis which is then published in the club magazine.

Vice President: In the absence of the President they are to chair the general and committee meetings. He / she is to arrange for a guest speaker at meetings.

Trip Coordinator: To assist members in preparing trips. The Trip Coordinator would speak about up and coming trips as well as past trips at the general meeting. Trip sheets would be held and all trips on the notice board would need ratification by this person.

Association Delegate: Reports back to the club the activities of the South Australian Association of Four Wheel Drive Clubs (SAAFWDC). He / she is the voice of the club at meeting which are held monthly at state head quarters. This person is empowered with the task of been able to vote on behalf of the club on issues at association level, then report this back to the club through the general meeting.

Membership coordinator: Welcomes visitors at club general meetings. Introduces the visitor to the club. He/she has a large part in the organisation of the annual Four Wheel Drive show. They will collect the club magazine from the printer, and distribute to members through the folders.

Secretary / Public officer: records the minutes of the general and committee meetings. Receives all correspondence in.

Treasurer: Manages the funds of the Club. Is the co-signer of the club cheque book with the President. He/ she would report on bank balance to the general meeting, and put forward for acceptance by the members of the general meeting any accounts for payment.

Other positions held with in the club, but do not hold the position of Director are as follows.

Education officer: Makes arrangement for ongoing training according to the SAAFWDC division of Driver Training Unit (DTU) The Education officer will attend monthly meetings of the DTU held at Association head quarters.

Ongoing theory and practical training would be coordinated by this person. He/She would oversee all club Advisors, Trainers and Assessors. He/she would be the voice of the club at DTU meetings, and report back to the club at the general meetings any information.

Social Secretary: Arrange social events. There are a number of main social events conducted annually. These are the Christmas meeting, mid year dinner and the AGM. In addition Mount lofty Rangers has now taken on an annual event of "Camp cookout". These event's are coordinated by the social team.

Property Officer: Holds the property of the club at a secure location. Keeps track of the equipment if loaned out to club members for club activities. Plus checks for damage on retune of the items. He/she arranges for badges and apparel for club members.

Magazine Editor: Collates all trip reports and reports from the Directors. He/she then puts all the information into a magazine format and sends to the printer for printing.

Insurance Officer: Reports at Club meetings any changing news relating to SAAFWDC national Insurer, TCIS.

Aboriginal Liaison officer: Attends monthly meetings at SAAFWDC head quarters and reports back to the club news relating to Aboriginal affairs and access to four wheel drivers in these areas.

National Parks officer: Attends monthly meetings at SAAFWDC head quarters and reports back to the club news relating to access to national parks

If you wish to do any of the above positions, then please put in your nomination form before the commencement of May meeting. On opening of the AGM all nominations will be read. If no one nominates for a position it is then offered to the person previously holding the position.

Thanks Christian for organising the weekend.


And it doesn't take too much effort to fill a social weekend with friends.

Wot Watts What?

If you are reading this article you are probably the owner of a 4WD vehicle. And if you're anything like the rest of us, you just can't bear the thought of leaving your vehicle in standard form. Tyres and suspension aside, the most common modifications need electricity to operate. Things like fridges, camp lights, driving lights and GPS systems to name a few. Quite a lot of stuff really, and it all chews up power. This can come from your car battery or another power source such as another battery or solar panels.

Now we can use a little bit of power over a long time or a lot over a short time, but the main thing is that eventually it will run out (ssh, don't mention the 'G' word). It would help then to know just how much power we are using. Up next are a few definitions and formulae that will help. Don't worry, if I can understand them they must be pretty simple.

Electricity is made up of electrons (hence the name). Think of them as baseballs. The faster the ball, the higher the voltage (volts). The more balls there are, the greater the current (amps). Stick them into a formula and you get:

Volts (V)
$$x$$
 Amps (A) = Watts (W)

You can fiddle with this formula depending on what you want to find out, eg:

$$W = V \times A$$
,

$$V = W/A$$

$$A = W/V$$

Now, this last one is the most use to us because we usually want to know how much current we are drawing from our power source.

In the case of driving lights of 100 Watts, draw is 8.3 amps:

$$100/12 = 8.3$$

The Versa Lite type fluoro of 11 watts draws about 0.92 amps 11/12 = 0.92

Most car batteries will deliver about 13.25 volts to start with so the above figures will change to 7.5 and 0.83 respectively. If a higher voltage reduces the current draw then trucks using 24 volt systems should draw even less. They do;

with the above figures becoming 4.2 and 0.46.

So why don't we use 24 volt systems in our cars. The simple answer is space and cost. Sometimes its hard enough to find space for one extra battery. Imagine trying to shoehorn four in! A word of caution though. Don't try to run anything on 24 volts unless it is specifically designed for it. The results would be probably dangerous and definitely expensive.

Try this exercise. How many watts would a solar panel need to be to keep the battery topped up to run a fridge? Lets use a 12 volt Engel fridge for example, which draws about 4.5 Amps when running. $V \times A = W$, so $12 \times 4.5 = 54$ Watts or 1296 Watts in 24 hours. Assuming the duty cycle is 25% then 324 Watts would be needed in this period. Assuming also that there are 6 hours of full capacity sunlight per day, the panel would need to be of 54 Watts/hour capacity.

My camper trailer, sometimes known unkindly by some disreputable club members as the 'Taj Mahal', needed internal lighting, so I bought a three-pendant house light, fitted with 240 Volt, 75 Watt globes. Armed with the above information I'm sure you've already worked out that this draws 0.94 amps from any caravan park's power plug. No problem, but what about when I'm doing proper camping? (I thought I told you not to mention the 'G' word). Surely I can use one of those inverter gadgets that bump up your 12 volts to 240. Buying one is easy but what size? Lets see, if 75 watts x 3 = 225 Watts then a 300Watt unit would do nicely. But can the batteries take it Cap'n? Yep, you guessed it, its formula time.

Watts of the lights @ 240V times 1.15 (15% inefficiency of the inverter) divided by the battery voltage will give me the current drawn from the battery.

$$(75x3[1.15])/13 = 19.9$$
 Amps.

I don't think the fuse will be happy with that tally and the duration would be pretty short.

What if I tried the new warm coloured fluoro globes that draw 14 watts instead?

$$(14x3[1.15])/13 = 3.71$$
 Amps

Much better.

This article is fairly brief and there are many variables to consider including cable size, fuses, etc. If in doubt consult an expert. Isn't that right Tim?

Have a play with the numbers the next time you add something—electrical to your vehicle. Just remember if you are going to talk about it around the campfire, do it before the port gets handed around.
