

BORDER TRACK INTERCLUB WORKING BEE

BEACHPORT AUSTRALIA DAY WEEK TRIP

Trip report Beachport to Carpenters Rocks by Shorty Wednesday 25th January 2006

Departed Beachport caravan park on a warm sunny morning at 10am. With Paul Tabone (Crooza) being trip leader he was joined by Dave, Sheralyn & Jack Willsmore (Shorty), Dave, Briggitta Koch & kids (Woody), Anthony, Sharon Tavelli & kids (Fish), and Pete & Jo Reed & kids. Exited road just outside Beachport township and after approx 10km of sand driving exited to bitumen at Southend, a small, pretty coastal town in sheltered bay. Turned off bitumen onto dirt track at "Boozy Gully", into the Canunda National Park, then took the "Kyber Pass" track which signalled 52kms to Carpenter Rocks. (no need for comment on track names here) This was a rocky, shaley track which was quite good, with quite a lot of green low growing vegetation alongside. We turned left, however couldn't get over hill which apparently was taken last year, so took another, entering beach onto very soft sand and driving approx 6.5kms, exiting beach at oil rig square.

11am, and as we were exiting sand we came across the Channel 7 Discover vehicle. Its 3 crew (Jamie, Pete and Kendall) had been filming for an upcoming segment about the wind turbines and were about to do some filming of their vehicle in sand. Sadly (for them) none were experienced in 4wd and were not up for driving their vehicle on sand. Our esteemed trip leader Paul offered his assistance and jumped in their vehicle so they could film it in the sand. This was made difficult by the fact that they had fully inflated tyres on soft sand, so Pauls exceptional driving skills were filmed. What won't appear on (their) film is the fact that exiting the beach was achieved by some "hard grunt" at the back end of their vehicle! But thanks to our very own MLR film crew, we have various footage of this event, which we will forward onto them (perhaps for a "woopsies" episode). After a quick chat and "celebrity photo shoot" they had our vehicles drive down the beach, and filmed us in convoy returning. So we may see this footage used in future episodes! Look out for their

story in April - Discover, on Channel 7.

After a quick loo break we headed off for lunch at Millicent Hill, and then played in the sand. Pete headed down first, appearing to easily ascend. All fired up, Paul and Shorty decended, providing many photo/film opportunities of "I think I can, I think I can" back up, but sadly, after "almost and nearly", this was not to be their day. Pete decided to give it another go, and to lots of cheering was declared the days "King of the Mountain".

Eventually Paul and Shorty quietly exited via the chicken track. We departed around 1pm, and shortly after when going over small hill with sharp RH bend approaching beach, Woody got stuck. After a quick snatch, we were mobile, naming this "Woody's Hump". We entered the beach again, to find heaps of debri scattered along our path. Bottles, wood, large pilons and stones to name just some. Approx 2pm and the sand became really soft, with Woody sinking, and family members becoming rather nervous because of approaching incoming tide. After letting down tyres and lots of digging and pushing he got out. Next came Fish and after providing some great "swinging of the back end", had to be recovered by Pete snatching him out. Several minutes after we were all through, Pete has done a rear tyre, and after pumping it up we're away again.

A unanimous decision was made by the drivers to take the nearest exit track off beach, so we headed inland. This track was hard, appearing to once have been sea bed or volcanic rock. Once again thick low growing vegetation to side of track. Non-eventful 18km drive with only a small brown snake providing a slight gasp. At 4pm we stopped at roadside to pump up tyres and headed to Carpenter Rocks for icecreams. Uneventful trip home along bitumen.

Since Paul had been driving solo for the day, Shorty Jnr took his passenger seat to film the days events, and after tea another "night at the movies" was had.

Tuesday 24 Jan 2006 Beachport.
