- Project 1 Bend Hut wall and foundation restoration Stabilised wall with bracing while up at Witchelina
- Project 2 Pug Hill foundation restoration, finish off long drop, install water feed to kitchen and solar panel, re-arrange bedroom
- Project 3 Move water tank from Mirra Well to North shed, install guttering and plumbing.

The dates are:

- Event 1: Saturday 18/4/2015 to Thursday 23/4/2015 (Over April School Holiday period)
- Event 2: Saturday 13/6/15 to Thursday 18/6/2015
- Event 3: Thursday 9/7/2015 to Friday 17/7/2015 (Over July School Holiday period)

More details will be provided at a club presentation over the next couple of months.

Pug Hut Restoration Update: There is still some minor restoration work to be done at Pug Hut but it appears that after our southern boundary fence run earlier this year, the Hut may be put to use as a base for the fencing contractors repairing 26kms of damaged fencing.

I know that the SA Nature Foundation are extremely happy with the work we have done down there but I would like to see if the Club could go that little bit further and furnish the hut. Member Scott Watkin donated 2 bunk beds and a friend from work donated a double bed base which have been placed into the hut. 

WATKIN'S WORKING BEE

17th January 2015

A Working Bee at Scott and Kerry Watkin's Little Farm. 17th of January.

On Friday 2nd of January I was driving home from the city and looked towards the hills. You may remember that it was pretty hot that day. It was so hot that my tyre temperature alarms were triggered (55 degrees on the road). It had been already declared a catastrophic fire risk day. A column of dense white smoke was visible not far from where I estimated our farm to be.



When I arrived home it was evident that the fire might be coming our way.

To cut a long story short, the fire came through 4 times during the next 24 hours. My brother, Craig and his wife, Michelle saved the day (and our house) by turning up on Saturday morning just as the second front of fire reached us. We were putting out spot fires every day for another week even though it had rained

40 mls.

The fires burned or melted all of our pasture, most of the fencing and pipework to troughs and irrigation. A lot of trees were damaged. Even our underground SA Power Network pit melted and so we relied on our generator for electricity for 9 days.

Behind the scenes people were rallying to come to our support and aid. During the fires the four of us knew we were on our own. Our area was deemed too dangerous

for the CFS to enter. Afterwards we heard that the MLR committee were thinking of us and had been considering ways to help. My Facebook friends were asking what they could do. It occurred to me that I would take years to repair and replace the damage from the fire. With so many generous and sincere offers of help I hurriedly made plans for a working bee. Tom Doody helped by making the day an official club trip. I explained the concept at the January club meeting and I was overwhelmed by the support.

We met at the Kersbrook Post office at 0930 on Saturday and hence drove the 2km along the recently reopened roads to Arpsyn Downs (the name we gave our

20 acres). After making sure that those who had parked under burned trees had moved to safer places, we all assembled for a briefing. There were the MLR members, my Facebook friends and family. Probably 40 people all together. Craig Watkin had plied his skills as a project manager and we had divided up the jobs to best employ the variety of skills available. Graham from the SES had provided safety glasses, ear protection and gloves. I have never seen so many chain-saws outside a Stihl shop.

The crowd dispersed and the work began.

Peter and Tom lead a gang who proceeded with rolling many kilometres of burned wire on to a big cable drum. This proved to be a great success and solved a major problem with what to do with the damaged wire. Shorty and a mob of others helped with restoring pipes and irrigation. Big piles of firewood, cut and stacked appeared where trees had fallen.

The enthusiasm of the lumberjacks had to be restrained when I discovered one gang had continued well onto my neighbour's land. Eric and a smaller group with chainsaws centred their activities near the dam. Quite a few yabbies were caught, a legitimate by-product of their efforts.

Burned materials, tyres and recently created junk was loaded onto trailers and carried to the skips that the council had supplied at the Kersbrook Oval.



Wayne and Nick re-clad a green house that had melted due to the radiant heat during the fires. Others re-plumbed the veggie garden and the orchard. Staples that lay where fence posts used to be were collected and all manner of jobs were done.

By early afternoon we had achieved a great deal and it was time for lunch.

With the meat vouchers donated by the winners of the MLR lucky numbers plus a little more from us (and some well earned refreshments) I thought we would be calling it a day. Volunteers

cooked up a delicious barbecue and we took some rest. BUT the willing spirit of the throng was strong and work recommenced.

The burned gardens around the house were cleared and many other tasks completed before we retired for a few more ice cold beers, wines and softies.

I cannot begin to say how grateful Kerry and I feel towards everyone who was able to help. There were others who we know wanted to help



and who would have, but for other commitments. Our spirits have been greatly lifted and any sense of loss has been restored.

"KEEPING IN TOUCH"

NGARKAT CONSERVATION PARK INTERCLUB WORKING BEE 28th & 29th March 2015

WHAT: Each year a group of volunteers from FWDSA affiliated clubs meet at the Ngarkat CP to undertake a number of tasks that have been developed in conjunction with the Senior Ranger, Natural Resources (SA Murray-Darling Basin, DEWNR) from Lameroo. These tasks assist DEWNR in maintaining, sustaining and enhancing the Ngarkat CP for all park visitors.

This year the work to be undertaken is again generally on or near the one way section of the Ngarkat CP Border Track and includes signage, fencing (repair, replacement or installation), fireplace & rubbish cleanup, signage, vegetation trimming, painting and rubble placement. DEWNR will be providing materials and specialist tools needed for the work and the volunteers will need to provide all the basic hand tools and labor.

The one way section of the Border Track is closed to public traffic until the first weekend of April and therefore will be closed to public traffic during the working bee.

WHEN: Weekend of 28th & 29th March 2015. Work starts at 9am on Saturday 28th March, but you may setup camp on the afternoon or evening of Friday 27th March.

WHERE: Meet at the Ngarkat CP Pine Hut Soak campsite (S35° 25' 20" E140° 52' 46"). See the map overleaf.

Directions:

Heading south from Tailem Bend cross the railway overpass, turn left onto the Mallee Highway; drive through Lameroo, Parilla and past the T-Junction to Bordertown (do not turn at the T-Junction), 5km west of Pinnaroo turn right on to Rosy Pine Lane (Ngarkat Park sign at this point, see RAA map 'Upper South East ref: J2), continue south for approximately 17 km. The Pine Hut Soak campsite is located just inside the Park entrance.

WHAT TO BRING:

Camping: Camper trailers and caravans can be accommodated. The site has one very good long

drop toilet but you need to bring everything else (water, food, shelter). Please note that the 28th and 29th March will still be in fire danger season so the "camp fire" will need to be artificial (a goo stave will be OV)

be artificial (a gas stove will be OK).

Equipment:

Tools Post hole digging tools, pruners, loppers, bow saw, handsaw, shovel, rake, hand tools.

A wheelbarrow will be useful for one of the tasks at Pine Hut soak.

UHF In car and handheld UHF radios will be useful, Channel 16 will be used.

Personal Working gloves and footwear, drinking water, sun protection (hat, long sleeves, long

pants, and sun screen).

Bring high visibility vests or clothing and possibly share them with your fellow workers.



The frog said, 'What, are you nuts? Didn't you hear what I said? I said kiss me and I will be your beautiful bride.'





IMPORTANT NOTICE

FROM THE DRIVER TRAINING UNIT (DTU) of 4WDSA

The government has introduced a requirement that all students involved in Vocational Education Training (VET), which the 4WD driver training certificates are part of, needs to have a Unique Student Identifier (USI). The purpose is to create a central location where all VET qualifications are recorded. Any student can then get copies of their qualifications even if the training organisation that issued them does not exist anymore.

The USI will commence on 1January 2015 and all new and continuing students undertaking nationally recognised VET courses will need to have a USI to receive their statement of attainment or qualification.

You create your USI online and provide it to the training organisation when you enrol to do a course. To create your USI you will need to access the USI website on http://usi.gov.au. This gives more information about the USI. The website is open now for you to create your USI.

From November 2014 the DTU will only accept applications for driver training courses that contain your USI. The application form for training manuals has been updated to include a section to record the USI. If the form you received from your training officer does not have an area to enter the USI, you have been given an out of date form. Ask your training officer for a copy of the latest application form.

Existing students already enrolled in the driver training courses will also need to apply for a USI and provide it to the DTU before your certificate can be issued. Also anyone requesting a certificate after completing the 4WD assessments will need to provide the DTU with their USI. We will need your USI before we can apply for the certificate. If you do not supply it, it will delay the issuing of your certificate.






