



#### **Course costs**

The course costs are very good value for what you receive. For the practical driving events you receive one on one training and assessment in your vehicle by a DTU Training person.

The DTU reimburses their Training Officers for their fuel costs so this is part of the cost you pay and the other is the property access fee paid to the landowner as most of our training venues are private property.

To do the Basic Driving and Recovery course and the practical training events you will need to purchase a set of training manuals which consists of a comprehensive reference manual and a training checklist.

Starting with basic operation and maintenance of your vehicle through to driving in all types of terrain and in the event of the getting stuck how to safely recover the vehicle. Throughout the course the emphasis is on learning safe and effective skills to enable you to enjoy your hobby to the full.

The training is conducted on a one on one basis with a nationally accredited instructor who is a member of a 4WD club and volunteers their time for the training. Therefore our fees are very low and include only your reference material, a reimbursement for trainers travel costs and property access fees if applicable.

Note: 4WDSA driver training is conducted in association with a registered training organisation which means that upon completion of the requirements in the assessment checklist you will receive a nationally accredited training certificate. However attainment of the certificate will require several weekends of training and assessment depending upon aptitude and previous experience.



## CAMP COOK PREPARATION

#### HEAT CONTROL TIPS FOR CAMP OVEN COOKING

#### 1. Pre-Heating your Camp Oven

While it is not necessary, placing your camp oven near the campfire while you are preparing your ingredients this will help warm up the oven ready for cooking.



#### 2. Understanding Heat Placement for Cooking

If you are unsure if you need bottom or top heat, just picture how you would prepare the dish at home.

If you're placing a pot on the stove top, then you just need bottom heat. If you're putting the dish into the oven, then you need top and bottom heat on the Camp Oven.

#### **Bottom Heat**

Bottom heat is perfect for cooking wet dishes like stews, chillies, soups, casseroles or even boiling water.

#### **Top and Bottom Heat**

Top and bottom heat is ideal for cooking meat, poultry, potatoes, vegetables, bread, damper, cakes and more.



# CAMP COOK PREPARATION

#### 2. Understanding Heat Control

Heat control is something everyone struggles with when they start camp oven cooking. Just remember **if you start off too hot too soon you will ruin the food**. It's best to work up to the right temperature.

So basically start off with less heat and after ten minutes check it, if you think it's not hot enough add a few more coals until you think you have it at the right temperature. I'm sure you would rather wait ten more minutes for it to be ready than have to run to Maccas?

When cooking with an open fire don't place your camp oven directly on the camp fire. use a shovel and take the coals you require and place them on your camp oven. Doing this will allow you to be able to better manage your heat control.

It's best to make your camp fire with good dry hard wood, as the coals tend to stay hotter for longer and require less coals and management. However If you don't have access to good wood you will still be able to cook with those coals it will just mean you will need to use more coals and you might have to change the coals more often.

If you are cooking food that takes a few hours, just remember to change the coals when needed.



#### NGARKAT Working Bee NGARKAT CONSERVATION PARK Cox's Mill Campground Upgrade Working Bee 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup> August 2016



WHAT: Within the Ngarkat CP, Cox's Mill campground is about 4km east along the track from the Pine Hut Soak campground to the Border Track intersection. It is directly adjacent Cox's Windmill, a relic from the pastoral days of the area. Cox's Mill campground has been used for many years as an ad-hoc campground for 4WD enthusiasts who are preparing to traverse the Border Track. Recently, DEWNR[1] and the 4WDSA Border Track committee planned an upgrade to the ad-hoc nature of the campground. This involved creating a separate entrance and exit to the campground and re-aligning the Pine Hut Soak track just away from the entrance to the campground. This work has just been completed by heavy equipment sourced by DEWNR.

Remaining to be done in this Working Bee is setting the boundaries of the campground using fencing in a similar manner to that at the Pine Hut Soak campground along with any residual clearing of vegetation. Fencing materials have been funded directly by DEWNR and through grant funding obtained by the 4WDSA Border Track committee. DEWNR will provide any specialist tools needed for the work; volunteers will need to provide basic hand tools and their labour.

**WHEN:** Weekend of  $13^{th}$  &  $14^{th}$  August 2016. Work starts at 9am on the Saturday, but you may setup camp on the afternoon or evening of the preceding Friday.

**WHERE:** Meet and camp at the Ngarkat CP Pine Hut Soak campsite (S35º 25' 20" E140º 52' 46").

See the map overleaf.

**Directions**: Heading south from Tailem Bend cross the railway overpass, turn left onto the Mallee Highway; drive through Lameroo, Parilla and past the T-Junction to Bordertown (do not turn at the T-Junction), 5km west of Pinnaroo turn right on to Rosy Pine Lane (Ngarkat Park sign at this point, see RAA map 'Upper South East ref: J2), continue south for approximately 17 km. The Pine Hut Soak campsite is located just inside the Park entrance.

#### WHAT TO BRING:

**Camping:** Camper trailers and caravans can be accommodated. The site has one very good long drop toilet but you need to bring everything else (water, food, shelter). You may like to bring wood for a campfire as the working bee date is well outside fire danger season.

#### **Equipment:**

**Tools** Post hole digging tools, pruners, loppers, bow saw, handsaw, shovel, rake, hand tools, battery powered electric drill with a range of drill sizes and spade bits, battery powered angle grinder with thin metal cut-off blades.

**UHF** In car and handheld UHF radios will be useful: Channel 16 will be used

initially.

**Personal** Working gloves and footwear, drinking water, sun protection (hat, long sleeves, long pants, sun screen).


Bring high visibility vests or clothing and possibly share them with your fellow workers.
