Friday 20TH October 2017

Got to Salt Creek around 2.30pm. Eric, his son and girlfriend and Ian had to wait because I was running late, so I had to write the trip report.

We got to the edge of the beach around 3pm, deflated the tyres to the appropriate pressures to drive on the sand, you always find out what you need to get when you don't have it. First time for me driving on this kind of sand which was real fun, Eric went first, then myself then Ian, all on channel 27 on the two way, but 10 minutes in Ian was the first to get stuck, not in a big way, bottomed out on the sand. Used the maxi tracks and he was on his way. As I am not used to driving on this sand, 10 minutes later I then got stuck trying to correct my steering, rocked back and forth, clutch smelling a bit then chucked it in low and was on my way, but realised with Ian, another 2 inches be nice.



Got to camp, set up and had a quick bite to eat, we had rods in the water around 6.20pm for the start of the fishing comp.





Saturday 21st October 2017

Weather was great, bit of a breeze but wasn't overly cold. Fished for about an hour but no bites, was just feeding the crabs, was great being close to camp, only 20 odd metres from beach. Went back cracked a cold one, started tea and kicked back, chatting around the fire taking in the sunset and then Ian said he was going to be up at 5.30am, but don't think he was, but none the less they were fishing by the time I got up, came back to camp for breakfast around 8.30am after and hour still no fish. But we weren't giving up just yet, so settled in for the day of coronas, beers, fishing and chatting.

Phil rocked up about around midday, set up his camp then chucked his surf rod in, after a few hours of nothing, the waters were looking a little bit murky, settle down for the night with good company, beers, food and laughter. The fire ashes under your seat for that warm feeling.



Sunday 22nd October 2017

Last day is here, all of us were out at the beach by 7 am for the final day at the camp, another rime seat in front of gods country, nice rainbow, little bit of drizzle in between sunny patches. Couple of hours in Eric hooked onto a mullaway, which was awesome, beginning to think there was no fish as I was keeping the crabs fed, then no more than 5 minutes later Phil hooked onto a mullaway, still no winner of the competition but we had caught something, until Ian pulled in a whopping 7 pound salmon which was the winning fish of the competition. Well done Ian great catch.



After that we went back to camp to start that slow process of packing up, then went for a drive up to tea tree for a look at the mouth but couldn't cross as the water was too deep, but great spots for camping around there not only on sand but grass areas as well.

Then we all headed back to the start along the beach, unfortunately lan got stuck, not bad this time, but again that extra 2 inch lift would come in handy we all thought. We all stopped at the grounds and put air in our tyres then set off to salt creek for a nice coffee and lunch, one last chat and set off for home.



All in all was a great weekend and fishing competition, great experience for someone that hasn't done any sand driving before, and thank you to Eric for a few pointers in surf fishing.



To measure the finished length - measure next to the neck of the garment near the highest point of the shoulder





Rob and myself together with Rob's sister and brother-in-law did a 6 week tour of Europe visiting 12 countries and 22 different cities utilizing 5 modes of travel, these being, plane, cruise ship, self-drive vehicle, train and bus. Our last stopover was a 3 night stay in Dubai and it was a recommendation that we don't miss the Arabian Adventures Sundowner Desert Safari and dinner, so we booked this through our travel agent. Its amazing when you land in Dubai, the sight you see from the tarmac is A380's and triple 7's dotted around the airport terminal, they looked like toys all lined up!

Emirates own Arabian Adventures, a fleet of 85 Toyota V6 Landcruisers. There is an average of 40 vehicles per desert safari dinner tour, 6 passengers in each vehicle @ \$135.00 AUD per head, that's \$32,400.00 AUD per trip. We were provided with an info booklet which we studied and were itching to see what the 5 hour safari was all about.



We were the last on the pick up from the hotel. There was one seat in the front of the vehicle with the driver, 3 in the back seat behind the driver and 2 in the rear seat. We sat in the seat behind the driver with another passenger. The vehicles are fitted with full internal roll bars, a sight that concerned me, oh god are we going to be tumbling down the side of a sand dune? The drivers are obviously professionally trained, and ours gave us a commentary of vast information as we drove from Dubai city to the Dubai Desert Conservation Reserve.



Once we reached the conservation reserve the driver pulled up to air down the tyres. To our surprise, set up in the desert there were about 20 air compressor stations so the vehicles could air down or up, yes, we're in Dubai remember! Now aired down, our driver set off and took us onto a flat sandy track which lead us to an area dotted with date palms, this was where we were to view a falcon show, bird that is! A couple of us swapped seats but I stayed put as I didn't want to succumb to travel sickness, although I thought ahead and took a travel sickness pill before I left. (We had forewarning that the ride might be a little rough).

So we hit the dunes behind a convoy of vehicles, all seemingly going in the same direction. I really wanted to have a video as a memory but found it extremely difficult to keep my camera upright. All the 4WD's were tracking on the top of the dunes, they weren't massively high though but close together, we were going like a bat out of hell twisting and turning, it felt like we were in a washing machine.

A couple of 4WD's lost traction and were stuck on the top, the passengers scrambling out to see what was happening. My head was going every which way and it felt as though my stomach had risen up to my throat. One passenger commented that they were relieved that they were in the front seat and had not eaten as yet, I thought, I'm glad I'm not in the very rear. Maybe the urgency was due to the beckoning sun setting. Phew, that was a real sand dune bash! I must say, good old Beachport has a lot to offer, and crossing the Simpson Desert, if you ever get the opportunity, just do it.



We took some beautiful photos of the sun setting behind soft coloured dunes and the driver took some portrait photos of each couple too. Sun was setting fast and it was back in the 4WD for another short bash to a traditional Bedouin-style camp for a delicious buffet dinner under a canopy of stars, but sadly, although it was a clear night, there weren't many stars shining. At the camp there were a choice of different activities for everyone to experience such as see the desert from the back of a camel, try mini sand boarding, get an ornate henna painting on your hands, or try a shisha pipe.

We relaxed and enjoyed the Arabic style buffet dinner of grilled meats, meze, desserts and unlimited select drinks which included beer and wine. I was intending on having the henna painting, but time seemed to fly by as we were chit chatting with our other 4 passengers, a couple from Sydney and two young fellas from the U.S. Rob tried the shisha pipe. The next minute the belly dance show started with only 1 dancer, quite entertaining but my impression was a "show" consisted of more than one lonely dancer. We made our way back to the hotel, a nice easy drive, much to the relief of the passengers on a sandy flat track and then the black top.


