After setting up it was time to chillax and mingle while checking out what trips we wanted to do across the weekend.


A chilly night was had to start off our weekend but we arose to clouds and the promise of sunshine Saturday for our Black Rock Peak trip.

#### YANKALILLA to CAPE JERVOIS 4WD TRIP 8 OCT 2017

About 25 vehicles from our club and nearly as many from the Adventure 4wd Club took part in this trip organised as a fundraiser by the Lions Club. About a dozen cars from Mt Lofty Rangers camped Wirrina on the nights before and after the event while the others came for the day.

After a cool night spent sitting around a warm fire and some early morning rain those camping at Wirrina set off for Yankalilla Showground to check in for the trip and the many day trippers also joined us so there were about 50 cars on the trip. This included the Lions Club members acting as trip leaders. We were divided into 5 groups which set of at regular intervals. By the time we set off the rain had all but stopped.

Most of the trip was on private property some times on well defined tracks, some times on freshly made tracks through green grass and sometimes we had to make our own tracks. The terrain was mainly hill green grassed country with occasional clumps of trees and many well fed cows and occasional flocks of sheep. We had great views of the surrounding country and when the cloudy skies became sunny, good views of the coastal beaches and towns. There were some steep and sometimes slightly tricky climbs and descents but most of us had little trouble with these.



Our route took us from Yankalilla past Normanville to some where near Lady Bay on the Main South Road before we turned off and headed up a steep hill for views and back down again until we came back to the main road just north of the turn off to Wirrina. After a short stretch on the black top we headed on tracks towards the coast passing the lake supplying water to Wirrina and coming out near the coast at Second Valley. After a short distance on the Second Valley Road we headed off road again until we reached Rapid Bay School with good views of the jetties (old and new), the limestone mines and the cricket ground next to the school seen before we arrived. The Lions club put on a great lunch (BBQ sausages and burger, various salads, a drink and fruit and ice cream for desert).

After lunch and a short blacktop stretch we went off road again and climbed Rapid Hill for views of the beach and mines at Rapid Bay and then came out on the main road again at Delamere. From here we went down hill and crossed Salt Creek near a second set of turbines on Salt Creek Hill. We then found a wide gravel road which lead back to the main road and along it to our finishing point near the Cape Jervois lighthouse. On our way in we saw the Sealink Ferry coming in from Kangaroo Island.

#### HOW TO TREAT A SNAKEBITE

Our South Eastern Section has updated its advice and procedures following the publication of a new snakebite study. <u>The Australian Snakebite Project</u> is the most comprehensive ever carried out, involved over 1500 patients and collated snakebite data from the past 10 years (2005-15).

"There are around 3,000 reported snakebites each year in Australia, resulting in 500 hospital admissions and an average of two fatalities."

The Australian Snakebite Project threw up some surprising statistics, which challenges many long-held perceptions about where snake attacks occur and how to treat them.

In those attacks in which the snake was positively identified, the brown snake was the most common biter (41%), followed by the tiger snake (17%) and redbellied black snake (16%).

There-quarters of the people bitten are males aged in their 30's. Most snake attacks occur near houses, not in the bush. Half of all bites occurred while people were out walking, with gardening and trying to catch a snake the most common other scenarios.

While only 20- 25 out of 835 cases they studied resulted in death, the effects of a snakebite can be debilitating and far-reaching. Three-quarters of those bitten experienced venom-induced consumption coagulopathy, which causes blood clotting and life-threatening haemorrhages. Acute kidney injuries, brain and muscle damage and cardiac arrest are other possible side effects.

"Surprisingly, they're often painless and may go unnoticed as tissue damage is mostly light – lacerations, scratches or light bruising along with some bleeding or swelling. As over 90% of snakebites we found to occur on the upper and lower limbs, these are the places to check first."

"Common symptoms include an unexplained collapse, vomiting and abdominal pain, bleeding or paralysis."

#### HOW TO TREAT A SNAKEBITE

Many dangerous myths surround the treatment of snakebites. The most important dos and don'ts include.

- Do NOT wash the area of the bite or try to suck out the venom. It is
  extremely important to retain traces of venom for use with venom
  identification kits.
- **Do NOT** incise or cut the bite, or apply a high tourniquet. Cutting or incising the bite won't help. High tourniquets are ineffective and can be fatal if released.
- **Do** bandage firmly, splint and immobilise to stop the spread of venom. All the major medical associations recommend slowing the spread of venom by placing a folded pad over the bite area and then applying a firm bandage. It should not stop blood flow to the limb or congest the veins. Only remove the bandage in a medical facility, as the release of pressure will cause a rapid flow of venom through the bloodstream.
- **Do NOT** allow the victim to walk or move their limbs. Use a splint or sling to minimise all limb movement. Put the patient on a stretcher or bring transportation to the patient.
- **Do** seek medical help immediately as the venom can cause severe damage to health or even death within a few hours.

The new study has prompted the RFDS SE to reverse previous long-standing advice about the importance of identifying the colour and type of snake. "Staying in the area after an attack can be dangerous and recent advances in medication mean we can now treat any snakebite with a generic polyvalent anti-venom, so identification is no longer necessary."







#### **FUN FACT**

#### Have you been to the Centre of Australia?

Info from the Westprint Mob and Geoscience Australia.

Officially, there is no centre of Australia. This is because there are many complex but equally valid methods that can determine possible centres of a large, irregularly-shaped area but here are some possibilities.

#### Centre of gravity.

If you had a cardboard cut-out of Australia, the place where it would perfectly balance on a pin is the Centre of gravity. The result is 23° 07' 00" South, 132° 08' 00" East; or just north east of Papunya in the Northern Territory.

#### Lambert gravitational centre.

Similar to the centre of gravity method, the location was calculated from 24 500 points at the high-water mark of Australia's coastline. In the 1930s when Dr C.T. Madigan travelled through Central Australia he calculated the centre of gravity by using a metal cut-out of Australia with a plumb bob and string. His crude measurement was surprisingly accurate as he selected a point less than 11 kilometres due west of this present position. The computed result of the 1988 project was: 25° 36' 36.4" South, 134° 21' 17.3" East; or just to the west of Finke.



#### Furthest point from the coastline.

Imagine the largest perfect circle that could be drawn anywhere inside Australia that only just touches the coastlines. The centre of this circle is 23° 02' 00" South, 132° 10' 00" East; almost the same position as the centre of gravity.

#### **FUN FACT**

#### Median Point.

If a box was drawn around Australia, just touching the northern, eastern, southern, and western-most points on the continent and drawing diagonal lines between corners the intersection is the median point. 24° 15' 00" South, 133° 25' 00" East; or just north of Orange Creek south of Alice Springs.

#### What Town is Furthest from the Australian Coastline?

Researched by John Deckert. Westprint Maps. Nhill.

This question has concerned me for years. The first time I visited Eromanga I was told that a surveyor had driven a peg near the centre of town and had said, "This town is further from the sea than any other in Australia". (I saw the peg.) During the research for the Westprint South West Queensland map I found this to be incorrect. Even a very elementary series of circles on a map showed that Alice Springs was much further from the sea. Some time ago I found three references making the claim for Eromanga so I thought it time to see if I could establish a correct answer.

#### Furthest point from the coastline

A series of concentric circles drawn on transparent material were moved over the top of a 1:5 million scale map of Australia until one circle was found to touch the coast at three points. Think of it as the largest perfect circle that could be drawn anywhere inside Australia that only just touches the coastlines. The centre of the circle was then marked and the coordinates scaled from the map. The Latitude and Longitude for this position is: 23° 02' 00" South, 132° 10' 00" East, and is shown on this Westprint map as the Tidal Centre of Australia.

The nearest town to the Tidal Centre is Papunya, a small community of about 450 people situated 200 kilometres west of Alice Springs.
