

In my briefing to all members before we headed out on our trips, I mentioned SAFETY, SAFETY, SAFETY! This was never more evident when on our way back from our trip on Friday, the first beach after leaving Beachport heading to Robe – you all know the one, well there was a what looked like a pretty tricked up 80 series Landcruiser that was parked across the sloping beach and having trouble. They were travelling alone, had way more than air in the tyres than they should have, had already lost a maxtrax in the sand so were down to 3. MLR being the good Samaritans we are, offered our assistance. I went back and reversed up to the 80 to get ready to snatch him out, he got all his new recovery gear out, which we checked for rating, all good so far, we attached the arrestor to the snatch strap after filling it with sand, I had a quick look under the front of the 80 for rated recovery points, still all good......after a chat to let him know the process I'd follow, we connected everything and moved everyone away from the danger zone – we were ready. 3, 2, 1GO.... he moved a little and then stalled which put extra strain on everything and then the recovery points came away from his car...... Luckily we had the arrestor on the strap otherwise things could have been a lot worse (read recovery points embedded in the back of my car), the arrestor took the weight of the recovery points down to the sand, the excess strap just hit the back of the patrol leaving no damage. Just a quick example of how things can go not how you expect them too.



So we get to write this report because we were the last to arrive....by 2days but at least we missed all the rain. Les and Steve found a nice little camp site 2 crossings past the King river hut. We had no trouble finding it after filling the shopping list sent by the boys on our way in. After setting up our camp Steve and Les had the camp fire burning and dinner ready, and no ordinary camp food here-Atlantic salmon, mash potato and asparagus with hollandaise sauce no less. We spent 3 nights at this camp doing day trips including Mt Buller where we had coffee and cake while watching crazy bike riders scramble down the mountain, Craig's Hut for a late lunch and amazing views. Cobbler Lake, a walk to the falls and some other nice tracks. So many ferns and creeks and rivers.


Tuesday was moving day we were up early to pack. Nice little camp next to the river except for the cows that came to visit early one morning and threatened to drag Steve's tent away after tripping over the ropes. We fuelled up at Dargo but missed lunch at the pub by 5 minutes, so had to settle for burgers at the shop and a beer at both pubs. Nice meander home through some back roads following the river.

Next day Trevor was keen to try Billygoat Bluff after hearing lots of good things about the track, what a wonderful steep climb, it goes on and on and on finally coming out at an amazing view over the valley below. Kangaroo Island

Do not take rabbits, bees or bee products onto the island. Potatoes are also prohibited unless they have been washed or brushed free of soil and are in new packaging.

Riverland of South Australia

Do not take fresh, unprocessed fruit and fruiting vegetables (including capsicum, chilli, tomato and eggplant) into the **Riverland of South Australia** without an itemised receipt from an SA retail outlet or a Plant Health Certificate.

South Australian Quarantine Checkpoints

Quarantine stations and fruit disposal bins are strategically placed throughout South Australia. Mobile guarantine stations can operate anywhere and at anytime within South Australia.

Keep receipts for purchased items. You may be required to provide proof of where some items were grown.
