<u>Magazine editor:</u> - Collates all material to go into club magazine – photos, trip reports, jokes, interesting 4WD related stories sourced elsewhere. Facebook administration.

5 Things you didn't know about Australia's deserts

Because of this, our arid regions are soaked in Australian history and culture, yet how many of us know about the land itself? Here are 5 facts you probably didn't know about our arid terrain and landforms.

- 1. Australia's desert centre is distinctly tied to dryness and a lack of water, yet the vast majority of landforms in the Outback are/were formed by water. This includes things like hills, escarpments, inselbergs, plateaus, mesas, ranges, gorges and valleys, as well channel country, scalloped dunes and much more.
- 2. There is a unique landscape found in many deserts called karst, which is the geological name for a landscape that is made up of a single type of soluble geology (normally rock). The most famous example is the Nullarbor Plain, which is a karst landscape, and is the largest piece of limestone in the world! It covers 200,000 sq km and stretches 1100km at its widest point; longer than the distance from Brisbane to Sydney.
- 3. Many of the streams and rivers of Australia's deserts, including places like Finke River Gorge, areas of the MacDonnell Ranges, Kings Canyon and much more, seem to defy conventional logic and physics. This comes about due to the collision of previous ancient terrains and more modern processes and climates, resulting in landforms that are geometrically mind-boggling.
- 4. Before the distinct deserts that we know today, there were ancient deserts residing either within or south of the current listed arid regions. Evidence of these forgotten deserts are seen in the Simpson and Tirari deserts, where more extensive fossilised sand ridges exist underneath the surface and are actually exposed in some areas along Warburton and Kallakoopa creeks. Another example is in the Great Victoria Desert, where the current east-west dune lineation hides ancient dunes lineated northwest-southeast.
- 5. An ancient lake once resided within our modern day deserts, which would consume and link lakes Frome, Callabonna, Blanche, Gregory and Eyre. Called Lake Dieri, it covered 110,000 sq km, which is over ten times the size of today's largest Australian lakes (Lake Eyre and Lake Gairdner are both around 10,000 sq km)!

Driving Lamps and Daytime Running Lamps



Vehicle Standards - Fact Sheet

MR 1517 7.17

This Fact Sheet provides general guidelines for lighting of motor vehicles, excluding motorcycles, with a gross vehicle mass less than or equal to 4.5 tonnes.

General Requirements

All lights fitted to a vehicle must be built and adjusted correctly so not to dazzle the driver of the vehicle and the driver of other vehicles.

Driving lamps and LED light bars

Additional driving lamps, including LED light bars, may be fitted without an application for modification, provided they comply with the requirements in relevant Australian Design Rules (ADR) and the South Australian Road Traffic (Light Vehicle Standards) Rules 2013, including:


- · The lamps must be facing forward.
- The colour of lamps must be white.
- The number of lamps must be maximum of 4.
- The lamps should, as far as is possible, be installed symmetrically in pairs to the front of the vehicle.
- If lamps are not fitted as pairs, they must be fitted to the front of the vehicle, symmetrically at the centre.
- The light must be wired so they can only operate when the vehicles main beam headlamps are on.
- The placement of lamps and associated brackets must not increase the risk of bodily injury to any person.
- The lamps must not be fitted to the top of a bull bar or above the bonnet line.
- The lamps must not protruding forward of the bumper bar or bull bar in a way which would adversely change the profile of the impact zone; and;

· The lamps may be fitted on the roof of a vehicle.

Daytime runninglamps (DRL)

Daytime running lamps (DRL) may be fitted without an application for modification, provided they comply with the requirements in relevant ADR and the South Australian Road Traffic (Light Vehicle Standards) Rules 2013, including:

- · The colour of the lamp must be white;
- · The number of the lamps must be 2;
- They must be symmetrically fitted on the front of the vehicle, reference to the longitudinal plane of the vehicle;
- They cannot be fitted to the roof, bonnet or side rear vision mirrors of the vehicle;
- They must switch on automatically when the engine is switch on;
- They must switch off automatically when the engine is turned off or the vehicles headlamps are switched on.
- They meet the dimension requirements shown in the figure below.

Specifically, Roger has a passion for Jeeps and has offered advice and mentored new club members who own Jeeps particularly whilst on organized club trips. His imparting of knowledge is based on personal experience and has provided those members with information to assist them in negotiating obstacles and setting up and maintaining their vehicles.

Lloyd Weaver — Lloyd has been nominated for his behind the scene graphic design efforts which has included designing the revised MLR logo; the winning sand flag; club award certificates and club letterhead. Lloyd has actively sought to assist committee members where he could and his designs have contributed significant value to MLR in terms of creating the Mount Lofty Rangers identity and increasing the club profile.

Martin Dunaiski — Martin has been nominated for his behind the scenes efforts in developing the MLR member database. The database adds significant value to MLR in terms of collecting and maintaining data in a single source of truth, therefore reducing the reliance on the ad hoc inefficient paper based system presently utilised. The database has resulted in an increase in data relevance and accuracy, and also resulted in efficient time management for our committee members who generously volunteer their time. Some examples of the database information being used are member contact details for general correspondence and communications; collation of club awards metrics and insurance compliance; trip attendance; member payment cross reference and social media access. The database also has the scope to increase its utility in the future as the maturity of the system continues to be developed and adopted.



10 Four Wheel Driving (4WD) Facts You Didn't Know

Over the recent years, 4WD has evolved from a hobby to a quintessential motoring lifestyle catering to large families, industries and businesses. 4WD vehicles provide that much needed support to families that are often mobile, industries that require access to places that common vehicles can't traverse, and a person's need to have something bigger and powerful for those "just in case I need it" instances.

After years of improvisation and evolution, 4WD has its share of facts and trivia that is both fun and useful knowledge. Here are some of them that are sure to increase your interest in 4WD.

- 1. 1898, Latil (French) Built a 4x4 gun tractor during the WWII era. This concept sprung from his manufacturing of power packs as replacement for the front axle shafts and horse of carts.
- The first 4WD vehicle was designed by Ferdinand Porsche (founder of Porsche cars). He designed the vehicle when he was 25 years old.
- 3. First mechanical 4WD was built by the Dutch company Jacobus Spyker in 1902.
- 4. Four Wheel drive auto company (FWD) built the first US vehicle in 1911. FWD supplied 4WD trucks to both British and US Marines during WW1.
- 5. Mercedes and BMW followed in 1926 with their line of 4WD vehicles for commercial consumption.
- 6. "Wankertank" or "Toorak Tractor": colloquial names for 4WD commonly heard in and around the Melbourne area. Wankertank are 4WD's that are only driven around town, while Toorak Tractor is a name pertaining to the exclusive eastern suburb of Toorak where these vehicles are mostly seen.
- 7. The first 4WD Formula 1 racing car was the Ferguson P99 Climax. It remains the most famous specimen to garner twin claims to fame. The first 4WD car and the last frontengine car to ever bag a spot in a F1 event.
- 8. The most radical 4WD vehicle is one made by a Russian armour-car builder Russo Baltique, who among all other details of the vehicle used whale penis leather as the seat covering. The Russian car company manufactures safety vehicles for Russia's Tsars and top officials. The vehicle is named the Dartz Prombron Monacco Red Diamond Edition which is claimed to be the world's most expensive vehicle at the time. Expensive it is, with gold-plated bulletproof windows, exhaust made of tungsten, diamond and ruby encrusted gauges and a Kevlar coating for the exterior. A shortage of whale penis leather was a concern until facts came in that a Blue Whale penis can grow up to 2.4 meters. The manufacturer has not mentioned so far the kind of whale that they get the penis leather from.
- 9. World's first pedal powered 4WD vehicle was created by a German fellow, Frank Fraune and called it the Trailcart. The Trailcart is a metamorphosis of a mountain bike and 4WD with 290Nn of torque. 400mm of axle displacements helping it master rugged terrain. This invention is receiving some serious reviews by investors which include Land Rover who tested the vehicle in its obstacle park in Wulfrath, Germany.
- 10. Australians are the world's biggest buyers of 4WD vehicles.
