<u>Membership officers (1 lead & 2 x assistants)</u>: - First point of contact for visitors that come to MLR, keep track of member attendance at club meetings and criteria for membership acceptance, welcome visitors and link them with a buddy, run the club night raffle and pay for any birthday drinks.

Website officer: - Maintain and update MLR website and Facebook administration.

Merchandise officer: - Organises clothing and other club approved merchandise for sale to members.

<u>Property Officer:</u> - Looks after club property and trailer, by maintaining where appropriate and lends equipment out to members.

<u>Education Officer:</u> - Organises club training and awareness days. Liaises with 4WDSA Driver Training Unit for wider training opportunities.

<u>Magazine editor:</u> - Collates all material to go into club magazine – photos, trip reports, jokes, interesting 4WD related stories sourced elsewhere. Facebook administration.

Beachport 2021 trip report



Saturday 23 January - Robe to Beachport Trip lead by Eric.

After a great nights sleep Friday, the club gathered at the camp kitchen to assign themselves to trips. The day was to be quite warm and the crew of seven vehicles prepared to head off lead by Eric. Off to Robe first and then back to Beachport.

We all motored off down the highway to park up by the lawns and go and grab some ice cream. Once we had satisfied our hunger, we set off towards the closest beach entry with anticipation. We aired down our tyre pressure before we hit sand. There was a strong buzzing sound causing an issue, oh no, not a vehicle in trouble at this early stage, but a swarm of bees going on the attack, this however did cause a bit of antagonism!



The beaches were quite dry with low rain levels recently and also were quite chopped up. There were some easy going patches and some difficult rutted beach entries and exits that Eric liked to call WOMBAT HOLES. They certainly shook my old bones when trying to ascend a dune. Not too many re-tries that I could tell but I was nearer the back. The traffic seemed to be behaving politely and with Eric's driving skills and giving some well received instructions we all progressed along nicely. We passed occasional 4wd enthusiasts

requiring some rescuing and the groups had it under control. Interesting to see the techniques as we motored along. As we drove between beaches and dunes occasionally we came across other big groups but everyone seemed quite good at letting us through. The sand hills got a little bit more gnarly and some fast steering and choosing the correct momentum was paramount to achieving our goal. Tasman was driving his re-built 80 Series on this trip and was conscious of the engine and was very cautious not to over rev. Low range and the right gear saw him call on the massive torque and traction and only had a few re-runs when trialling different techniques. No rescues required for Tas.

Well a nice lunch spot was required and Eric knew the best spot to stop, to also enjoy a cast off and catch a fish or two. "I'll just get a little closer to the water's edge". "Ah well we can pull that out later" and thanks to Greg Healy that was so easy.

Some special track side photos were taken of each car while we had a difficult uphill to ascend with quite a bit of distance between us. Lunch time was nice with the ocean breeze but the pesky March Flies caught us out every now and then. After the great haul was packed away it was time to remove a stuck vehicle and press on. Always a good idea to pack a matching reel for your big rod, lucky there was a small one tucked in the back somewhere. Well, it is off heading south again and the tracks had become even a little more powdery and this meant for a bit more momentum and skills a plenty. With about halfway of the distance behind us we motored off to find some quite modified larger vehicles ploughing through the lower beaches and the extra power was welcomed.





The track up near the reeds was probably the safest bet which seemed reasonably solid but a slight deviation and weighty vehicle caused some anxious moments. Thanks again to Eric for his excellent advice. If you can't drive out slightly uphill forwards then it is a good chance a strap and a gentle pull backwards would be the next best option. Thanks Tas. The scenery was grand along the way and there are many photos we could all show.





We did, however, see a vehicle travel too close to the water's edge on our ever slowing journey as we moved back to camp, but we observed from a distance another member of their crew winch him out of danger.





HISTORIC CAR REGISTRY

A 90 day conditional registration scheme For Historic, Left Hand Drive and Street Rod vehicles.

Members of Mount Lofty Rangers 4WD Club are eligible for Club Registration of Historic, Left Hand Drive and Street Rod vehicles through the club.

- 1. Inspect vehicle and make sure it meets the criteria for Club Registration. If previously registered bring current registration information including current permits for modified vehicles.
- 2. Complete MR334 form and original to owner and copy retained by Mount Lofty Rangers 4WD Club
- 3. Log book supplied to vehicle owner and explanation of the use.
- 4. Record and retain a copy of MR334, Certificate of Exemption and Statutory Declaration if needed.
- 5. Record the Log book Serial Number on the Certificate of Registration along with the date of issue, the Club Stamp and sign the certificate. Retain Copy of Registration papers as proof car was registered at log book issue.


