G'day Rangers...

So far this year I have had the opportunity to attend several MLR trips, and speak with friends who have 4WD and hear about their trips as well. As a result, I thought for this newsletter, I would briefly discuss “knowledge” verses “ability”, as many people in the community place themselves in situations (you may have also seen this) where it becomes obvious that one of these is lacking.

In simplistic terms, knowledge is the theoretical or practical understanding of a subject. Whilst ability is being able to implement the theory in a competent / proficient manner. Knowledge and ability combine to create learned behaviour i.e the skills that can be used to successfully complete the required task.

As an example, the majority of people have the knowledge to write their signature. They also have the ability to do so in a proficient manner with their master hand, however, whilst having the knowledge they may not have the ability to sign using their non-master hand.

Skills are usually something that has been learned, so, we can develop our skills through the transfer of knowledge. Just because people have a 4WD badge on their car or have seen people “wheel” on YouTube doesn't mean they have the ability to proficiently do so themselves.

So what's my point...some people search for knowledge e.g. for 4WD'ers by seeking counsel from more experience people, training organisations or joining Clubs. The advantage of joining a Club is that whilst you are obtaining knowledge you can also gain valuable experience in a safe/supported environment and therefore increase your ability through attendance at club activities.

MLR already has multiple trip opportunities available with more to follow in the coming weeks / months. Some key activities worth noting include the annual awards dinner in May (registrations are open via website), Camp Cook, Loftytyfest 21 in Oct (registrations open via website) and Christmas at Wirrina in Nov. Keep an eye out for additional trips and details as trip leaders bed down information.

Website officer: - Maintain and update MLR website and Facebook administration.

Merchandise officer: - Organises clothing and other club approved merchandise for sale to members.

Property Officer: - Looks after club property and trailer, by maintaining where appropriate and lends equipment out to members.

Education Officer: - Organises club training and awareness days. Liaises with 4WDSA Driver Training Unit for wider training opportunities.

Magazine editor: - Collates all material to go into club magazine – photos, trip reports, jokes, interesting 4WD related stories sourced elsewhere. Facebook administration.

What is interesting, is that being 4wd’ers, many may know of Reg Sprigg for making the first crossing of the Simpson Desert in a **“G60 Nissan Patrol”** with his wife Griselda and children Margaret and Doug in 1962. Note, this was before there were any tracks as the oil exploration only occurred because of Reg’s work. It is worth watching ‘Being First is Forever’ which is a re-enactment type documentary Pat Callinan made with Margaret and Doug who drove a replica of the “G60”.

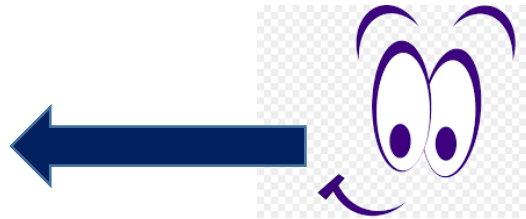
Reg started Arkaroola Wilderness Sanctuary in the Northern Flinders Ranges which many MLR Members would have visited and of course Margaret and Doug continue to run ‘Arkaroola’ to this day.

What I found interesting when finding this diving chamber is the fact that Reg Sprigg was a man of many talents and was quite the pioneer (in many ways).

REG SPRIGG'S DIVING CHAMBER

Reginald Claude Sprigg (1/3/19 – 2/12/94) a pioneering South Australian geologist and adventurer. His enquiring mind and willingness to challenge the scientific viewpoint of the day led to many great discoveries. Reg found the oldest animal fossils in the world the Ediacaran fossils (on display at the South Australian Museum) and the deepest undersea canyons in Australia, one of which is now named Sprigg Canyon in his honour. He also discovered the Cooper Basin oil and gas fields and helped establish the companies SANTOS and Beach Energy. In his early days, Reg studied under Sir Douglas Mawson at The University of Adelaide. A conservationist ahead of his time, Reg created the Arkaroola Wilderness Sanctuary to preserve the flora, fauna and geology of the northern Flinders Ranges.

Reg and his family lived on Baker Street, Somerton Park and then in a home they built and affectionally named 'Arkaroola' at number 30 Esplanade, Somerton Park.

Reg's geological interests extended under the sea. He was an early adopter of scuba diving in the 1960s and built his own underwater diving chamber from a disused boiler. He commissioned a research vessel, SAORI built at Searles boatyard, Port Adelaide to confirm his discovery of massive undersea canyons south of Kangaroo Island. He and his team of scuba divers completed the first benthic survey of Gulf St Vincent, establishing a valuable baseline for the plants, animals and sub-surface terrain in existence at the time. These results are still referenced today.

The diving chamber, built by Reg's company Geosurveys, finished its days 600km from the sea at Arkaroola. In 2012, a group of South Australian divers launched an effort to restore the chamber and preserve its history. The chamber was brought to Adelaide and restored over a period of four years by a dedicated team of volunteers led by Dr Richard Harris from the Diving and Hyperbaric Medicine unit, Royal Adelaide Hospital.

It stands now as a monument to the early days of underwater exploration in South Australia and to Reg Sprigg's tenacity, achievements and spirit of adventure.

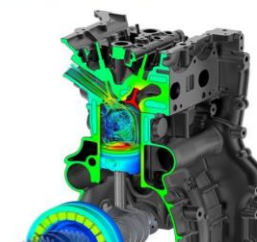
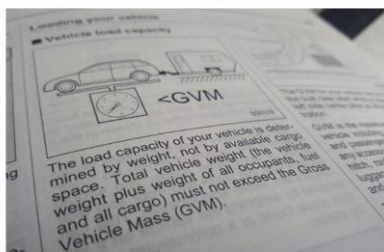

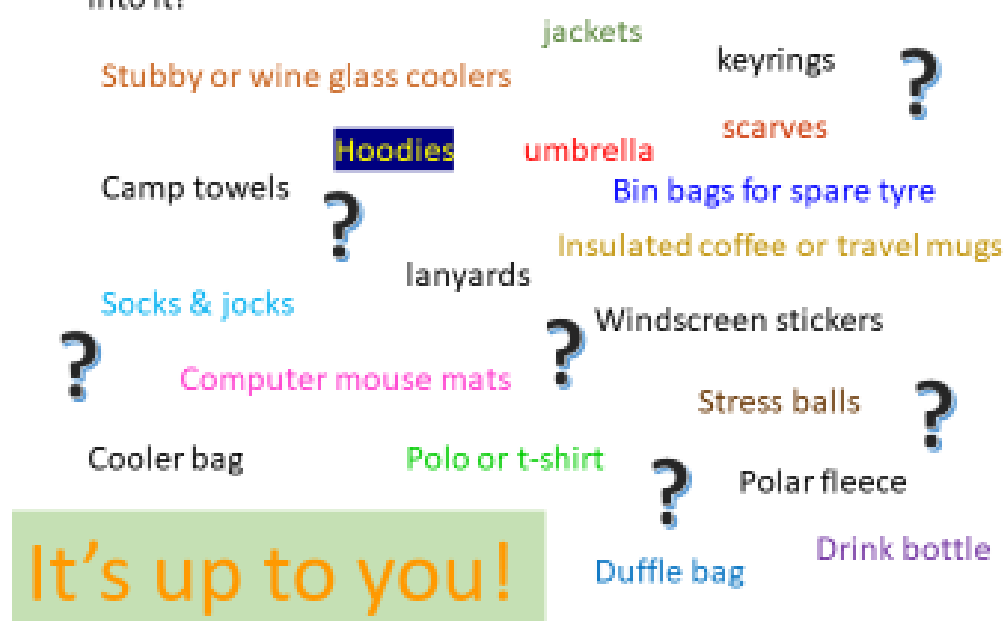

HISTORIC CAR REGISTRY

A 90 day conditional registration scheme For Historic, Left Hand Drive and Street Rod vehicles.

Members of Mount Lofty Rangers 4WD Club are eligible for Club Registration of Historic, Left Hand Drive and Street Rod vehicles through the club.

1. Inspect vehicle and make sure it meets the criteria for Club Registration. If previously registered bring current registration information including current permits for modified vehicles.
2. Complete MR334 form and original to owner and copy retained by Mount Lofty Rangers 4WD Club
3. Log book supplied to vehicle owner and explanation of the use.
4. Record and retain a copy of MR334, Certificate of Exemption and Statutory Declaration if needed.
5. Record the Log book Serial Number on the Certificate of Registration along with the date of issue, the Club Stamp and sign the certificate. Retain Copy of Registration papers as proof car was registered at log book issue.
