Treasurer: - Looking after club financials. Sponsor liaison.

Secretary & Public Officer: - Minute taking for meetings. Correspondence in and out.

Trips Coordinator: - Primary point of contact for members trip planning, advice and attendance sheets. Communicates trip calendar to members.

4WDSA Delegate: - Attends bi-monthly 4WDSA meetings and is the voice of MLR, also reports back on any relevant information from 4WDSA that affects MLR.

Membership officers (1 lead & 2 x assistants): - First point of contact for visitors that come to MLR, keep track

of member attendance at club meetings and criteria for membership acceptance, welcome visitors and link them with a buddy, run the club night raffle and pay for any birthday drinks.

Website officer: - Maintain and update MLR website and Facebook administration.

Merchandise officer: - Organises clothing and other club approved merchandise for sale to members.

Property Officer: - Looks after club property and trailer, by maintaining where appropriate and lends equipment out to members.

Education Officer: - Organises club training and awareness days. Liaises with 4WDSA Driver Training Unit for wider training opportunities.

Magazine editor: - Collates all material to go into club magazine – photos, trip reports, jokes, interesting 4WD related stories sourced elsewhere. Facebook administration.

Committee Member: - Supports other Officers of the committee, and helps with club events and trips where needed. If you would like to share your experience and contribute to the running of the club, please speak to a current committee member to obtain a nomination form.

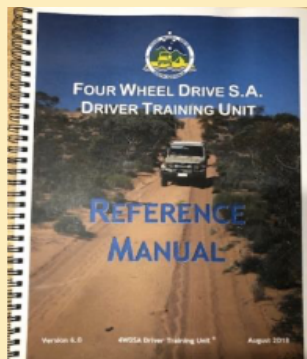

Trip Report

Witchelina Working Bee Trip Report by Deb Ophof

We set out on Saturday 22nd April on the trip for “Pete’s Tantalising Tour of Witchelina Station”. I was very excited as I have many years of experience on the land and it had been about 4 years since I had properly reconnected with country. It was very special for soooo many reasons

After a long drive on the bitumen, we pulled in at Farina to let some air out of the tyres for the drive in to Witchelina and I played tourist while Pete got busy with the task at hand. (I had no idea of Farina’s history and the importance of this town’s contribution to transportation, the railway, and also both World Wars.)

The drive in to Witchelina didn’t disappoint – so good for my soul to see the red dirt again. By the time we had stopped by the Homestead to let the Nature Reserve managers know that the 4WD club’s trip leader was back in town, we were running late for happy hour – a cherished daily tradition on these tours I was soon to learn. Setting up by the creek at the Homestead Campground that first evening was particularly basic, giving way to preparation of nibbles as “beer o’clock” was calling. I soon met the other club members who had already arrived and they made me feel instantly a part of the group – such lovely, friendly people.

The next morning, we were escorted by the property manager to the Bend Hut precinct where we set up our camp for the next four nights along the creek line. The rest of the group arrived on Sunday afternoon. Now red dirt has its appeal, but every time we got near water (dams, turkey nests and creek bed rock pools, even swamp-lands) we all expressed our appreciation as each was uniquely beautiful. There was some dissent about whether the Little Corellas added to the experience, but it was pretty much unanimous that at 6am several thousand Corella voices didn’t accommodate a sleep in.

Trip Report

We spent two and a half days trimming back vegetation and cutting out what seemed like thousands of a particularly prickly and nasty bush, so that the 'Toorak Tractors' that Nature Based Tourism brings wouldn't get scratched paintwork. Everyone worked hard and we managed to complete all the tasks we had been set. Every vehicle and every person involved has their own scars and scratches to prove their participation. The rest of the time was spent driving the tracks and playing tourists ourselves, including a day trip for a pub meal at Marree for lunch on Thursday. We covered just about every tourist track (plus a couple of others) on the property before we left, over several different terrains. We even had an educational tour complete with commentary by the property managers and accompanied by their four guests on Wednesday.

**Now I learned a few things out there –
some of it at my own expense.**

Here's some of what I learned:-

- 4WD club members love to film their day – there are cameras front and back of just about every vehicle. So when you hop out and dance with the Bearded Dragons to get them off the track, it is inevitable that it will be captured on a camera or two. The sillier you look, the happier you make the camera owners. (In my case the Gods intervened and a mishap may well have destroyed all evidence.)
- Bearded Dragons don't run off the track when you chase them, they run along the track and under the car in front or behind – adding to the amusement of people in other vehicles. Same goes for Skinks, Stumpies and just about any lizard. Oh, and they would rather make you run after them if it's a really warm day, than let you catch them. Doesn't matter that there are other vehicles following in convoy & you are trying to stop them from being run over.
- Mount Lofty Rangers 4WD Club has established history at Witchelina and there have been several other previous tours. On each occasion volunteering on various projects, including rebuilding huts, sheds and tanks. The club is acknowledged by the Nature Foundation in the track and tour manuals, on the website, and there's a plaque to commemorate the volunteering efforts of members attached to the wall of Pug Hill Hut which was one of the huge projects undertaken (you can be proud, your members rock).

- Someone always needs to be rescued on each trip: whether it be from getting bogged in sand, sinking in mud, stuck on rocks or losing the track, there is always at least one rescue for each trip. In our case it was a rescue from mud in a creek bed (photographic and video evidence captured).
- Apparently Pete's alter ego is "Recovery Pete" and if anyone needs to be pulled out, he is there with the right gear. The rescue is always preceded by a good laugh at the victim's misfortune and a conversation about what might have been done differently. It's all delivered with good intention and no offence is taken.
- Happy hour is a very important event at the end of each day's drive and plans possibly may be altered to ensure it goes ahead! Usually held around a campfire, there is great pride and stiff competition over who builds the best campfire. Preparation of nibbles to accompany is serious business and there is considered conversation about who will bring what nibbles the next day. Don't forget to take food to contribute for nibbles! And beverages.
- Navigation equipment loses satellite connection, or the display goes blank, or both, at the most inopportune times. Guess work is not always accurate. Laminated maps are welcome back-ups.
- Talking into the radio on channel 26 when everyone else is on channel 27 means that they may not hear you.
- Rock crawling along creek beds is fun but definitely very bouncy.
- How to use a tyre deflation tool instead of a stick or rock (and why) to let the air out of the tyres (though I have never broken a stick in a tyre valve, I can see the merit).

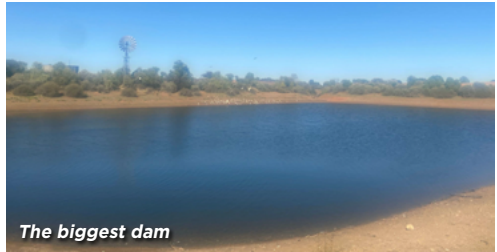


Trip Report

Bunkers/Flinders Ranges National Park Community Service Trip Thursday 11th – Monday 15th May

I am seeking expressions of interest to take part in a Community Service Trip that also has benefits.

Ikara-Flinders National Park has been extended by adding the Bunkers area to the park. Contained within this additional area is a former portion of the Sky Trek track operated by Willow Springs Station known as Loves Mine Track.

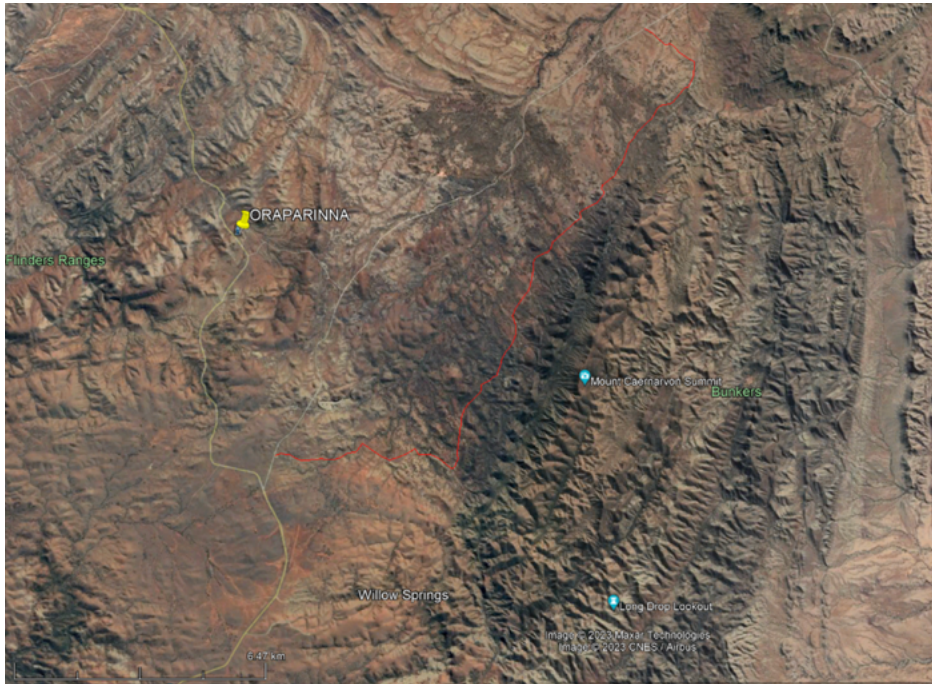
This track is now the access route for fire vehicles, emergency evacuations and also part of a Flinders Bike Trail (hence the emergency evacuations) and has not been maintained.

The Committee has undertaken to assist the Rangers by cutting back vegetation, filling pot holes and also filling erosion at various creek crossings along his 20km track to enable a grader to bring it to a suitable standard for 2 x 4 vehicles.

The proposal is that we base ourselves at the Oraparinna Headquarters staying in the Shearers Quarters (or camping if you wish) from the 11th May through to the 14th or 15th depending on the progress of the work. Possibly arriving and setting up on the 10th so we can put in a full day's effort on the 11th.

The benefits are that you will get to see a portion of the Flinders not available to most people, the Club will build a relationship with the Ikara-Flinders and also the Gammon Ranges, Rangers that may open up other opportunities to assist.

If 40 hours of volunteer work is completed, (cumulative over the year) then you become eligible to receive a code that provides you with free entry and camping in a wide range of State National Parks. i.e. the Ngarkat working bee held recently also counts to this total, or any other volunteer work in a National Park.

- Nominations close end of February for the preceding year
- The MLR Awards Sub Committee will review the nominations and select the winner for the period.
- The winner will be announced at the annual MLR awards night.

- Always friendly and supportive consistently helping others.
- Continued fundraising efforts.
- Volunteer efforts for the betterment of the Club.
- Behind the scenes support.

NB – there is no requirement to have lead a trip to be eligible for this award

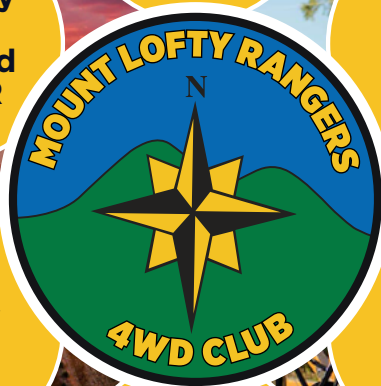

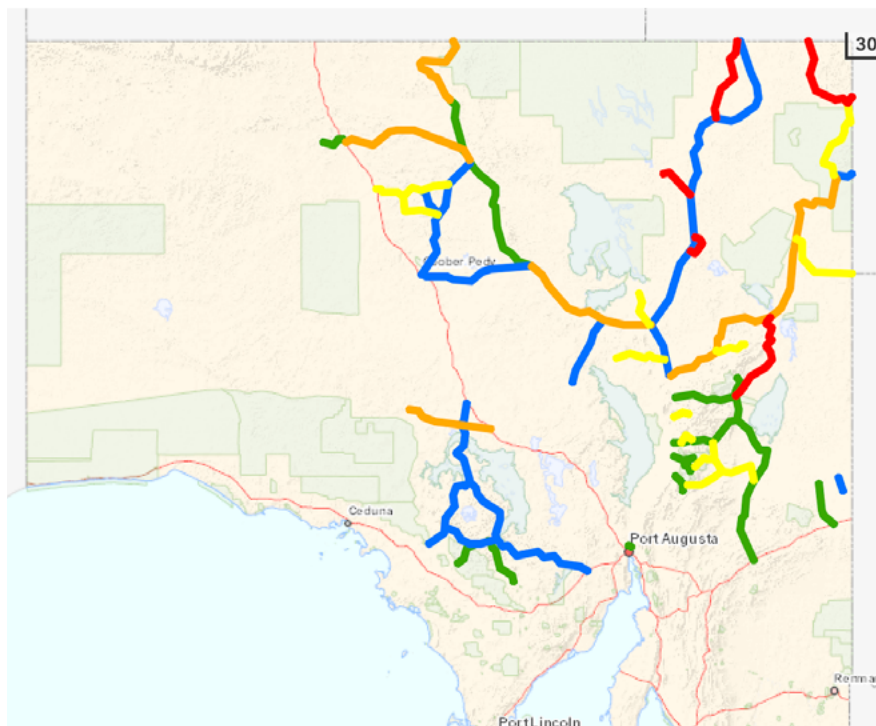

A 90 day conditional registration scheme For Historic, Left Hand Drive and Street Rod vehicles.

Members of Mount Lofty Rangers 4WD Club are eligible for Club Registration of Historic, Left Hand Drive and Street Rod vehicles through the club.

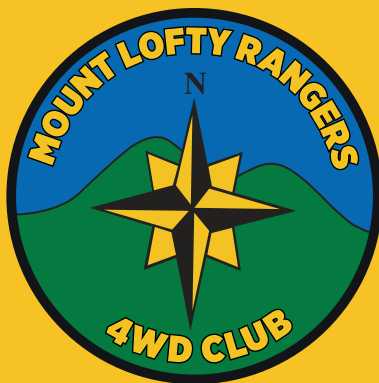
1. Inspect vehicle and make sure it meets the criteria for Club Registration.
If previously registered bring current registration information including current permits for modified vehicles.
2. Complete MR334 form and original to owner and copy retained by Mount Lofty Rangers 4WD Club
3. Log book supplied to vehicle owner and explanation of the use.
4. Record and retain a copy of MR334, Certificate of Exemption and Statutory Declaration if needed.
5. Record the Log book Serial Number on the Certificate of Registration along with the date of issue, the Club Stamp and sign the certificate.
Retain Copy of Registration papers as proof car was registered at log book issue.

IF YOU HAVE CLUB REGO PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOUR BOOK IS STAMPED
