Keep reading for a brief description of each role:

President: - Convenes all meetings of MLR. Meeting with 4WDSA to push the MLR interests. Sponsor Liaison.

Vice President: - Facilitate monthly topic of interest e.g. guest speakers, awareness sessions etc. Becomes acting President when the President unavailable.

MLR club registration officer.

Treasurer: - Looking after club financials. Sponsor liaison.

Secretary & Public Officer: - Minute taking for meetings. Correspondence in and out.

Trips Coordinator: - Primary point of contact for members trip planning, advice and attendance sheets. Communicates trip calendar to members.

4WDSA Delegate: - Attends bi-monthly 4WDSA meetings and is the voice of MLR, also reports back on any relevant information from 4WDSA that affects MLR.

Membership officers (1 lead & 2 x assistants): - First point of contact for visitors that come to MLR, keep track

of member attendance at club meetings and criteria for membership acceptance, welcome visitors and link them with a buddy, run the club night raffle and pay for any birthday drinks.

Website officer: - Maintain and update MLR website and Facebook administration.

Merchandise officer: - Organises clothing and other club approved merchandise for sale to members.

Property Officer: - Looks after club property and trailer, by maintaining where appropriate and lends equipment out to members.

Education Officer: - Organises club training and awareness days. Liaises with 4WDSA Driver Training Unit for wider training opportunities.

Magazine editor: - Collates all material to go into club magazine - photos, trip reports, jokes, interesting 4WD related stories sourced elsewhere. Facebook administration.

Committee Member: - Supports other Officers of the committee, and helps with club events and trips where needed. If you would like to share your experience and contribute to the running of the club, please speak to a current committee member to obtain a nomination form.

Planning a Club Trip/Event


Anyone planning a club trip or event please follow the procedure as per below.

SALT CREEK FISHING TRIP

1st - 3rd December 2023

"Eric discovers new species of Shark, Monster Whaler Shark caught, lan drags MLR into the 21st century with a fishing robot"

INTRODUCTION

Eric Kalderovskis once again launched the 12th Annual "Salt Creek Fishing Trip" to see who could catch the biggest Mulloway a.k.a. the Silver Ghost! After a false start (due to high winds) the event was rescheduled from November into 1st week of December, and the weather was really quite habitable for humans and not stinking hot, only 1 rain shower, but 'twas a tad bit windy by Saturday arvo.

Numbers were unfortunately halved due to reschedule but 9 MLR 4WDs still made the trip. As a new bloke this trip was great education fodder as the club stalwarts showed us how to get into the National Park via Tea Tree entrance (which is often under water) & how to get up the initial sand dune safely without over-cooking the throttle/ don't dig yourself in if you get bogged / simply roll back down & try again if necessary! There is safety in numbers & everyone was very helpful.

CAMP

Camp 25 was our home for the next few days which gave us good shelter from the south westerly winds. Eric's lad Adam & others created a nice campfire in the middle which provided a good congregation



point. For those suffering internet withdrawal you could get the faintest whiff of reception if you climbed the tallest dunes – excellent workout for the calves & you were richly rewarded with a beautiful vista at the top as well.



FISHING

Fishing pretty much kicked off straight away on the Friday by lunchtime with everyone posting up on the beach out front of Camp 25. Eric did a great job as tour leader & Rex Hunt wannabe – what this man doesn't know about fishing you could write on the head of a pin I reckon! He owns something like 60 different fishing rods, when he talks fishing – listen, and he's so wonderfully adept & happy to share information.

Technically speaking the rig loadout was generally a 1.2m 50lb mono leader with 3 Mustad 6/0 hooks in close succession, weighted down by a 6oz sinker with 4 wire extensions for stability. Main line was ideally mono to avoid tangling in the winds that braid can produce, running off a 5-7000 spinning reel, atop a 12 foot surf rod. Bait was IQF pilchards, squid, garfish in order to lure in the mulloway OR Australian salmon/ sharks etc. This setup is quite a strong/ powerful combo in order to get the bait far enough into the gutters AND keep it there in sometimes washy/ strong currents.

On Friday Ian caught a big 2m bronze whaler shark after a battle that lasted nearly 30 minutes & a 60cm Mulloway which had to be thrown back as 82cm is the legal size in SA otherwise he would have won the comp – his was the only Mulloway caught on the trip. John Edwards got onto an Australian salmon that was near the half metre mark getting onto the leader board early on Friday. Con was lucky enough to catch a massive 40cm mullet.









Saturday morning resumed with overcast & windy conditions that by after lunch saw the afternoon's session abandoned. Whilst many people got onto a few smaller salmon etc. here & there it was Yours truly (Gaven) who got onto the winning fish - a 53cm Aust. salmon, having caught & returned a nuggety stingray that put up a great fight. Interestingly it was here that Eric discovered a new species of fish known as the "Poodle Shark" who when approached jealousy guarded the winning fish as if he had caught it himself!

Waking up Sunday morning to an Awesome day, blue sky, gentle offshore wind and almost flat seas. Sadly the fish did not respond to any of the bait offered to them so time to pack up and head home via the Meningie Bakery.









This running of the annual fishing comp saw a major technological development when Ian showed up with a \$2000 drone designed specifically for taking rigs out to sea using cameras focussed downwards to the water. This allows the operator to scan parts of the coastline with excellent aerial vision to precisely drop the rig into the best parts of gutters OR even near visible fish sightings. Amazing stuff, real pro-show equipment but it must take some real skill to learn how to co-ordinate. Sadly nobody captured any photo's of Ian and his Drone.




BIG THANKS

"KEEPING IN TOUCH"

NGARKAT CONSERVATION PARK

INTERCLUB WORKING BEE 23rd & 24th March 2024

WHAT:

Each year a group of volunteers from FWDSA affiliated clubs meet at the Ngarkat CP to undertake a number of tasks that have been developed in conjunction with the Senior Ranger, Natural Resources (SA Murray-Darling Basin, DEW) from Lameroo. These tasks assist DEWNR in maintaining, sustaining, and enhancing the Ngarkat CP for all park visitors.

This year the work to be undertaken is again generally on or near the one-way and two-way section of the Ngarkat CP Border Track and includes trail marking & clearing, fencing (repair, replacement or installation), fireplace & rubbish clean-up, track maintenance, signage, vegetation trimming and painting. DEW will be providing materials and specialist tools needed for the work and the volunteers will need to provide all the basic hand tools and

The one-way section of the Border Track is closed to public traffic until the first weekend of April and therefore will be closed to public traffic during the working bee.

WHEN:

Weekend of 23rd & 24th March 2023. Work starts at 9am on the Saturday, but you may setup camp on the afternoon or evening of the preceding Friday.

WHERE:


Meet at the Ngarkat CP Pine Hut Soak campground (S35° 25' 24.7" E140° 52' 46.2").

Overflow, if necessary, to the nearby Nanam Well and Cox's Windmill campgrounds. Naturally, as this is an official working bee, you do not need to pay for camping nor the park

Directions:

Heading south from Tailem Bend cross the railway overpass, turn left onto the Mallee Highway; drive through Lameroo, Parilla and past the T-Junction to Bordertown (do not turn), then after ~1.9km turn right on to Rosy Pine Road (Ngarkat Park sign at this point), continue south for ~14.7 km to the Park Entrance (there may be one or two gates near the end of this road). 250m on from the Park Entrance is the visitor information shelter and a further 70m is the turn left to the adjacent Pine Hut Soak campground.

WHAT TO BRING:

Camping: Ca

Camper trailers and caravans can be accommodated. The Pine Hut Soak campground has one long drop toilet, but you need to bring everything else (water, food, shelter). Please note that the working bee dates will still be in fire danger season so the "campfire" will need to be artificial (a gas stove will be OK for cooking).

Equipment:

Tools Post hole digging tools, pruners, loppers, bow saw, handsaw, shovel, rake, hand tools, battery powered electric drill / angle grinder with a range of drill sizes and spade bits.

UHF In car and handheld UHF radios will be useful; Channel 16 will be used initially.

Personal Working gloves and footwear, drinking water, sun protection (hat, long sleeves, long pants, sunscreen).

Bring high visibility vests or clothing and possibly share them with your fellow workers.







Historic Car Registry



A 90 day conditional registration scheme For Historic, Left Hand Drive and Street Rod vehicles.

Members of Mount Lofty Rangers 4WD Club are eligible for Club Registration of Historic, Left Hand Drive and Street Rod vehicles through the club.

- Inspect vehicle and make sure it meets the criteria for Club Registration.
 If previously registered bring current registration information including current permits for modified vehicles.
- Complete MR334 form and original to owner and copy retained by Mount Lofty Rangers 4WD Club
- 3. Log book supplied to vehicle owner and explanation of the use.
- 4. Record and retain a copy of MR334, Certificate of Exemption and Statutory Declaration if needed.
- Record the Log book Serial Number on the Certificate of Registration along with the date of issue, the Club Stamp and sign the certificate.
 Retain Copy of Registration papers as proof car was registered at log book issue.
